



#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE**



Times, they are a changin'. Back in the days of yore, to the 1900s just 26 years ago, things were different. Sort of like they were different in the 1800s, and like they'll be different in the 2100s. However, there is one thing we know for certain. We know where we are right now and change continues and is needed, like it or not.

The Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association is no different. Changes have been happening here since, well, 1958. Back then it was a business, Punta Gorda Isles, Inc. It wasn't until years later that it became the non-profit 501(C)(3) community organization we know today, the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association. During those years, the major local pastime changed from shuffleboard to tennis to pickleball. Pop music favorites have changed from Elvis, Connie Francis and Chubby Checker...to Taylor Swift, Jelly Roll and Lady Gaga.

According to sunbiz.org (the Division of Corporations for the State of Florida), Punta Gorda Isles, Inc. was a for-profit corporation established on May 1, 1958. The Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association, Inc., a not-for-profit corporation, was first filed with the State of Florida on January 25, 1966. That makes the PGICA a tad-bit younger than I've been told, but still quite impressive. A 60th birthday would then be coming up in January, which sounds like party time to me!

Now, the state corporation files might be incorrect, but I'm not sure what else should be used as documentation. If you have any other ideas, please let me know.

I digress. Things are constantly changing, and that includes our PGICA. We can no longer sustain ourselves

with membership as our primary revenue source. Today, only 23% of PGI households are members. There are many more options for socializing and being involved in the community than there were even just a few years ago. Clubs, groups, volunteering, entertainment, communication and socialization are all around us. A computer search engine and social media can find you anything you want or need. Google and Facebook are all it takes.

Throw in a worldwide pandemic and several catastrophic natural disasters and we aren't just in a pickle; we're floating around in a whole jar of pickles. From September 1, 2021, to September 1, 2025, membership dropped by more than 13%. The really scary part is, even with warning flags raised to all, membership has continued to drop by more than 13% over the past 12 months. We gain wonderful new members each month, but former members continue to drop at an alarming rate

The PGICA needs to keep evolving with the times. Pivoting. Finding new purposes and revenue streams, while sticking with the mission and IRS 501(C)(3) tax exempt nonprofit status of civic involvement and education.

Change is always needed, and change is always happening.

Please support your PGICA changes. Support the programs and initiatives. Support our advertisers, attend the weekly markets, enjoy the arts and crafts fair, participate in classes, be a volunteer, and encourage new members.

# SUNSHINE LADY

#### Adeline L. Seakwood January 27, 1924 - September 3, 2025



Adeline Leonard Seakwood, 102, of Punta Gorda, Florida passed away peacefully on Wednesday, Sept. 3, 2025, with her daughter, Nanette Leonard, by her side, along with close friends Virginia Mclewin, Christine Kist and Gabriele Childs.

Born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, Adeline lived much of her life in New York City until her marriage in 1980 to the love of her life, U.S. Marine Corps Maj. Herbert J. Seakwood. A trailblazer in the television and film industries, Adeline had a distinguished career as a production office coordinator. She worked on numerous iconic '60s TV shows, including "The Patty Duke Show," "The Trials of O'Brien," "Matlock," "The Defenders" and many more. Her impressive feature film credits include "Three Days of the Condor," "Ragtime," "Superman," "Starting Over," "Godspell," "Annie," "Trading Places," "The Secret of My Success," "The Boys in the Band," "Death Wish" and countless others. Over the years, she had the privilege of working alongside industry legends such as Robert Redford, Christopher Reeve, Michael J. Fox, Farrah Fawcett, Peter Falk, E.G. Marshall, Robert Reed and Paul Newman, to name a few. In addition to her production work, Adeline taught a class at

the New School in New York City, passing her vast knowledge and passion for the industry to the next generation. When she celebrated her 100th birthday, Robert Redford graciously signed a photo from their time together on the set of "Three Days of the Condor," sending her warm birthday wishes. Adeline began her professional journey as a John Robert Powers model before venturing into acting, with roles in TV shows and films such as Alfred Hitchcock's "North by Northwest" starring Cary Grant. However, her true legacy was behind the camera, where she spent the majority of her career.

A co-founder of her union Local 161/IATSE, Adeline played an instrumental role in elevating the position of "production secretary," leading a successful campaign to change the title to "production office coordinator" — now known as "production coordinator" in credits across film and television. In 2008, she was honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award from her union, a testament to her immense contributions to the industry. Today, Local 161 remains a union of script supervisors, production accountants, payroll accountants and production coordinators who work across films and television (both narrative and documentary), and commercials. Adeline and Herb relocated to Punta Gorda, Florida over 30 years ago, where they became deeply involved in their community. Adeline served as the Sunshine Lady for the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association (PGICA) for three decades — a title she truly embodied, welcoming new residents to PGI and brightening the lives of all who knew her. She also volunteered for more than 25 years with the Isles Girls & Guys — a nonprofit organization under the PGICA that organized estate sales — as a greeter. She was known for her warmth, kindness and her signature hugs, which were always a highlight of the volunteers' interactions with their loyal customers. Adeline LOVED to dance and could always be seen bustin' a move at local block parties and rockin' to the music of The BoogieMen every month at Harpoon Harrys.

Adeline is survived by her daughter, Nanette Leonard, The Nilsens, Janine, Morgan, Gunnar, Corissa, Carsten, and Ronen, Ian, Natalie, and Troy Leishman.


#### **PGI FISHING CLUB**

Our off-shore anglers also took advantage of the red snapper harvest window and calmer summer water. The rewards were plentiful for those willing to brave the heat for a long day on the water. With the closure of red grouper, anglers maximized their trips by catching yellowtail snapper, African pompano, large mangrove snapper and amberjack. Who doesn't like to land a big fish while out on the boat.

Our anglers are gearing up (literally) for the transition to autumn fishing and the many surprises it brings. Some will be tracking permit moving through to try their luck, some will focus on the near shore king mackerel migration, many will key into the schooling redfish, and some will focus on the year-round trout fishing.







ity Council elections are next month. There is not early in person voting but there will be vote by mail and in person voting on election day. Election Day is Tuesday, November 4. All City residents will have the opportunity to vote for a councilperson from District Five.

The two candidates are incumbent Melissa Lockhart and opponent Bill Page.

Ms. Lockhart has a bachelor's in business and has been a local small business owner since 2008. Melissa and her wife Tiffany live in Burnt Store Meadows.

Mr. Page has an MBA in Finance and is retired from his executive position as a manufacturing controller for a fortune 100 company. Bill and his wife Ann live in Burnt Store Isles.

Note that the precincts have been realigned for Punta Gorda. Election Day voting will be at Charlotte County Event and Conference Center, Isles Yacht Club and the Congregational United Church of Christ. There will not be voting at the PGICA.



October 28 Monthly happy hour at the Four Points by Sheraton Hotel library room in the lobby.




