



My thanks to all of you for what you do and best wishes for the holidays and a wonderful 2026.











monthly party which features a delicious pot-luck buffet and a chance to chat with others.


Host and Toast is another popular monthly event but on a smaller scale. A few members meet at the home of the member and enjoy a coordinated dinner and conversation.



unta Gorda City Council has been busy. By a majority vote, Dr. Debi Lux was elected mayor and Jeanine Polk was elected as vice mayor.

I was able to interview Councilmember Janis Denton and she reported, "We have replaced the roof on City Hall to keep it from ongoing damage. It has been leaking since 2020. The council chambers are being restored. We are working on a plan for the old City Hall, saving money by using Lashley Community building instead of the \$4,500 a month at the museum. We are working out a plan for the marina and just had an Public Workshop to get input from residents and interested businesses. Harbor Walk should be open before the





end of the year. The area around the Charlotte Harbor Event and Conference Center is usable, but they say it's going to take a long time to fix the actual walk railings. Pickleball courts are finally out for bid for restoration. Gilchrist Park restrooms will be open hopefully by the end of the month. Offices were successfully moved from Towles Plaza to the City Hall Annex and the Herald Court building which will save a lot of money in rent. We have restored Herald Court and prepared for future possible storms with Tiger Dams and clearing out drainage. We are thankful to the residents who responded to our requests for input for Bayfront at Gilchrist Park. We are working on a plan for Bayfront which should benefit the community. We have a hospital emergency center being built and later a hospital will be added. We/re working with the Waterfront Hotel people. Also working with Fishermen's Village to approve a sustainable and appropriate plan. We have new restaurants both in Fishermen's Village and downtown that are coming..that's just part of what we have been up to lately."

Vice Mayor Jeanine Polk is looking towards "solving the infrastructure needs that have been ignored for a long time, which brings us to the costly repairs and upgrades. The water treatment plant, the wastewater treatment plant and expansion are all past due so now we find ourselves in an emergency situation."

Council just approved a contract for much needed repairs to the Freeman House. Council worked with T.J. Thornberry and local builders group (CDBIA) that will replace the roof and do the basic repairs for less than one fourth of a previous price.

Anyone who was following Florida State law SB250 that declared Land Development Regulations to be null and void if they were 'more restrictive or burdensome' should read new State Law SB180 that extends the deadline for changing LDRs until October 1, 2027. The newly passed SB180 allows any person to sue the city if they believe new LDRs to be more restrictive or burdensome.

The next City Council meeting will be December 3 at 9 in the Laishley Community Room, 120 Laishley Court. Enjoy the holidays.

The holidays are a time for joy and giving, but unfortunately, they can also create ideal conditions for criminals. Shoppers rushing around, stressing to find the perfect gifts, leaving purchased gifts in vehicles, and people traveling or away from home for holiday events can also fill criminals with holiday cheer. Additionally, holiday parties often lead to an increase in drinking and driving.

To help ensure everyone has a safe and joyful holiday season, the Punta Gorda Police Department will increase holiday patrols throughout December. This will include more police presence downtown and in shopping districts, as well as dedicated DUI patrols. Here are some steps you can take to stay safe and avoid becoming a victim this holiday season.

When you are shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings.
- Park in well-lit areas, making sure that gifts and valuables are out of sight and your vehicle doors are locked.
- If shopping with children, make sure they have been taught to seek out a store clerk, security guard or police officer should they become separated from you.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash when shopping. Pay with credit cards or checks when possible.

When you are away from home:

- Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped while you're away.
- Ask a neighbor to watch for unexpected packages, flyers and more. Leaving items outside your home for a long time signals to criminals that your house is vacant.
- Be careful about what you post on social media and who can see it. Criminals have become very savvy in using social media. Posting information or photos about your travel plans can inform criminals that your home is unoccupied.

When you are out for the evening:

- Make sure that doors and windows are closed and locked.
- Leave lights and a TV turned on so it appears that someone is still home.
- Keep gifts and valuables where they cannot be seen through windows or make sure that window coverings are closed.
- If you may be drinking alcohol while you are out, designate a sober driver, plan on calling a taxi, or utilize a ride-share service. Never drive when you are intoxicated; even buzzed driving is drunk driving.

Other safety tips:

- The holidays are a prime time for package thefts. Have packages delivered to a secured location, like your workplace, a neighbor's, or a family member's house. You can also ask the post office to hold your packages until you're able to pick them up.
- After opening gifts, avoid advertising valuables in your home by displaying packages for TVs, computers or other expensive items. Instead, break down boxes and packaging and dispose of them in garbage bags or cans.
- Criminals often target people's kindness during the holiday season by asking for charitable donations door-to-door, over the phone or online. Only donate to legitimate charitable organizations you trust.
