
joined by crew members Dan Avenancio, Dave De LaMotte and Suzi De LaMotte

Roland's dream came full circle and his admiration for GTOs is still apparent. Just recently though, Roland bought a 1964 Volvo. But that's another story for another day.




### **TENNIS CLUB**



### **GOVERNMENT UPDATE**

It seems our local government representatives are in a fight with local state representative Vanessa Oliver over who should have control and ownership of the City of Punta Gorda water system. State Representative Vanessa Oliver has proposed legislation for what the City is calling a hostile takeover of the City water. She wants it to be transferred to the County. She did not contact nor discuss with either party but both the City and County claim they first got wind of this when they read the small legal notice that Representative Oliver posted in the newspaper the weekend of December 6. The City Council quickly called an emergency meeting to discuss and council voted unanimously against the proposal. This was quickly followed by a special meeting by the Board of County Commissioners where they too voted unanimously against the proposal. On December 17, Representative Oliver had a meeting with Representative Danny Nix and State Senator Ben Albritton. County officials, City officials and residents spoke against her proposal, yet the three legislators voted in favor of the legislation.
