State Representative Vanessa Oliver (District 76) refuses to back down from her bill for her proposed hostile takeover of the Punta Gorda City water system. On January 13, Oliver introduced HB 4077 to the State legislature. Despite mounting pressure and formal demands from local government leaders, Oliver says she will not back down on her controversial proposal.

Charlotte County Commissioners voted to send a formal letter to Representative Oliver demanding the immediate withdrawal of the bill. "We need to know the money, we need to know what we're doing here," said Chairman Joe Tiseo of the Charlotte County Commission. "To continue to amend the bill like this is like trying to put lipstick on a pig."

The Punta Gorda City Council also opposes the bill. Councilmembers expressed deep concern that Oliver's bill could cripple the City's ability to pay off long-term utility debts, likely forcing significant rate hikes for the Punta Gorda City residents.

Developing Minds and Bodies is the title of the new mural placed on the Cooper Street Recreation Center. It is a reminder of the many years of dedication so many have put into our community. Past Cooper Street directors Anna Caldwell, Zelda Smith, Grace Nurse and Buster Brown were in attendance at the reveal. Reverend Haddock talked about the history of the building, recognizing its deep meaning to the heart of the community and its purpose of developing the youth, along with what it meant to him personally growing up in Punta Gorda.

The Cooper Street Recreation Center in Punta Gorda has a rich history, originally established as a safe gathering space for African Americans during the Jim Crow era. It has served the community for decades, providing various programs for youth and families, and has been a vital hub for cultural and social events.

Dr. Curtis (principal at Murdock Middle School) was also present. He is on the YMCA Punta Gorda community board, who currently leases the building from the City of Punta Gorda.

Along with continuing to fix our infrastructure and damages from the hurricanes, City Council has committed money toward the water plant and wastewater plant and have made provisions to improve failing infrastructure. Council is working to increase impact fees so that cost is shared by new development. Council is also working to rehabilitate Laishley Marina and considering all options to make this happen as quickly and efficiently as possible.

City Council meetings will be on February 11 and 25. County Commissioners meeting will be February 10.
